

Indiana Department of Correction Executive Summary June 2008

Tables 11 and 13

➤ This report marks the end of Fiscal Year 2008. Tables 11 and 13 have been created to report the total number of admissions per committing county, for Fiscal Year 2008. Table 11 details the number of admissions for Adult offenders and table 13 details the number of Juvenile admissions.

Tables 1 and 2

Arizona offenders housed at the New Castle Correctional Facility have been transported from Indiana back to Arizona. With the exception of 19 offenders still held in IDOC with pending Indiana charges stemming from their role in the April 2007 New Castle disturbance, all Arizona offenders have vacated Indiana.

Indiana Department of Correction Population Summary

- There were 25,034 adult male offenders (including 1,786 county jail "back-ups" and 154 in contracted beds) on June 30, 2008.
 This population is 3% above the operational bed capacity.
- ➤ There were 2,378 adult female offenders (including 135 county jail "back-ups" and 68 in contracted beds) on June 30, 2008.

 This population is 2% above the operational bed capacity.
- ➤ There were 794 juvenile male offenders in the Department's facilities on June 30, 2008. This population is 18% below the operational bed capacity.
- ➤ There were 136 juvenile female offenders in the Department's facilities on June 30, 2008. This population is 32% below the operational bed capacity.
- ➤ There were 9,786 adult males on parole in Indiana (9,042 Indiana parolees and 744 other jurisdiction parolees) on June 30, 2008.
- ➤ There were 1,352 adult females on parole in Indiana (1,251 Indiana parolees and 101 other jurisdiction parolees) on June 30, 2008.
- ➤ There were 259 juvenile males on parole in Indiana (243 Indiana parolees and 16 other jurisdiction parolees) on June 30, 2008.
- ➤ There were 49 juvenile females on parole in Indiana (47 Indiana parolees and 2 other jurisdiction parolees) on June 30, 2008.

Definitions

For the purpose of this report, the following definitions apply:

<u>Admission</u> – The means by which an offender enters the custody or jurisdiction of the Indiana Department of Correction. For this report, with the exception of the return of an escapee, this does not include a return from a temporary absence.

<u>Average Daily Population</u> – The sum of the daily beginning counts for a month, divided by that month's number of daily beginning counts.

<u>**Reginning Count**</u> – The number of offenders physically present at the beginning of the day (ie, 0000:01 hours). <u>**Class A Felony**</u> – An offense whereby a person convicted of this felony shall be imprisoned for a fixed term of thirty years, with not more than twenty years added for aggravating circumstances, or not more than ten years subtracted for mitigating circumstances.

<u>Class B Felony</u> – An offense whereby a person convicted of this felony shall be imprisoned for a fixed term of ten years, with not more than ten years added for aggravating circumstances, or not more than four years subtracted for mitigating circumstances.

<u>Class C Felony</u> – An offense whereby a person convicted of this felony shall be imprisoned for a fixed term of four years, with not more than four years added for aggravating circumstances, or not more than two years subtracted for mitigating circumstances.

<u>Class D Felony</u> – An offense whereby a person convicted of this felony shall be imprisoned for a fixed term of one and one-half years, with not more than one and one-half years added for aggravating circumstances, or not more than one year subtracted for mitigating circumstances.

<u>County Jail "Back-ups" (Jail Bed Count)</u> – Those offenders who have been committed to the Indiana Department of Correction, but are housed in a county jail until they can be transferred to a Department of Correction intake facility. The county receives \$35.00 per day, per offender, to house these offenders.

Ending Count - The number of offenders physically present at the end of the day (ie, 2400:00 hours).

Felon - A person convicted in any jurisdiction who might have been imprisoned for more than one year.

<u>Level 1 Security Classification</u> – Minimum security level. Facilities which are designated as Level 1 have the least restrictive security measures in place.

<u>Level 2 Security Classification</u> – Medium security level. Facilities which are designated as Level 2 have a moderate degree of security measures in place.

<u>Level 3 Security Classification</u> – Maximum security level. Facilities which are designated as Level 3 have very restrictive security measures in place.

 $\underline{\text{Misdemeanant}}$ – A person convicted in any jurisdiction who might have been imprisoned for not more than one year.

<u>Murder</u> - An offense whereby a person convicted of this felony shall be imprisoned for a fixed term of fifty-five years, with not more than ten years added for aggravating circumstances, or not more than ten years subtracted for mitigating circumstances.

<u>Operational Capacity</u> – The total bed capacity of the facility. The capacity of a facility is the number of beds authorized for safe and efficient operation of the facility.

<u>Pre-Dispositional</u> – An individual ordered by the Court to the Indiana Department of Correction for evaluation prior to sentencing.

<u>Release</u> – The means by which an offender leaves the custody or jurisdiction of the Indiana Department of Correction. For this report, with the exception of an escape, this does not include a temporary absence.

<u>Safekeeper</u> – An individual whom the Court has determined to be in imminent danger of serious bodily injury or death, or who represents a substantial threat to the safety of others, and whom the Court has ordered to the Indiana Department of Correction for custody and security control.

<u>Secure Confinement Units</u> – Denotes maximum control with the most restrictive security measures in place. <u>Vacancy</u> – The number of beds available for assignment.
